


STAFFING



In the classrooms we are continuing to focus on each day and the learning that needs to occur across this semester. We do however need to begin considering student numbers. HUMAN ENDEAVOUR

Across the school you may begin to hear our students talking about 'Human Endeavour'. This is our whole school integrated topic for the semester and will be integrated across curriculum areas. Classes will be exploring and celebrating the many human endeavours that have shaped and continue to shape our lives. This is a big topic for us to explore; let's begin with breaking down the definition:

<u>Human</u> - a human being; person <u>Endeavour</u> - an effort to do or attain something

It seems appropriate that we launch this topic this term when we are also celebrating 50 years since a human walked on the moon. The theme for Science Week ($12^{th} - 16^{th}$ August) is 'Destination Moon, More Missions, More Science'. The Book Week ($19^{th} - 23^{rd}$ August) theme this year is 'Reading is my secret power!' These activities will create great opportunities to celebrate and explore human endeavour in action.





In this newsletter you will see messages from each class providing you with an overview of work that will be covered during this term. We hope that you enjoy their news and are able to support our students as they embrace the many teaching and learning opportunities during the term.

SPOTLIGHT ON . . . Classrooms

ROOM 1: KINDERGARTEN MRS LISA MILLER

Welcome back everyone. After a busy and successful term two the kindies have come back relaxed, refreshed and ready to go.

This term we are learning about transport in our theme called 'Wheels, wings and other things'. It is going to be an interesting theme with lots of vehicles to be explored and learn about in the sky, on the roads and floating about in the sea.

We have an airport/airplane in our dramatic play area as well as a mural on our back wall which will continue to be a work in progress throughout the weeks.

This term our focus in English will be on Onsetrime and Alliteration. We will also learn how to identify and generate rhyming words. Maths is all about copying and creating simple two part patterns, using language for measurement to



describe, compare as well as order length, size, mass and height, sequencing familiar events and routines while using everyday language such as morning, afternoon and daytime also exploring duration of time like quick, slow and fast. Working on our class mural will allow us to explore different ways of creating models and doing things as part of our Arts program together with engaging in music making and creating simple compositions. In Science we will be focussing on the Weather.

It will be a busy term in Kindy but we are looking forward to the challenge!

ROOM 2: PRE PRIMARY MRS ROBERTA SLATTERY

Our overarching theme for Term 3 in Pre-Primary is on Transport and Vehicles which integrates beautifully with our Science and Technologies topics. In Physical Science we are looking at the way objects move depending on the size and shape. In Digital Technologies we are looking at the principals of how objects move. Our HASS topic is Geography where students are developing an understanding of their personal world connecting themselves to their local community. In Literacy we are creating an author's corner to include Pamela Allen, Alison Lester, Peter Bently and Mem Fox which we are linking to our transport theme. Our Numeracy focus involves ordinal numbers, days of the week, 3D shapes, money, empty and full, as well as half and whole. Each learning area is integrated with our theme offering our class with hands on, multisensory and engaging activities. We are blessed to have a second nine week block with Charissa Delima from our Creative Schools Program. We will also enjoy our 100 Days of School, Bastille celebrations, a Booyeembara Park Excursion, our assembly, Father's Day morning, an Art Excursion, Science week, Book week and sports day. I look forward to meeting with you all at the Three Way Conferences on Monday the 5th of August. Thank you for your ongoing support as we work with your child on their learning journey.





ROOM 3: YEAR 1 MISS LIZZIE SMITH

Welcome back to Term 3, it's hard to believe that we're more than half way through the vear.

In Year 1 we've hit the ground running. Our overarching theme this term is 'Nonsense', to get us in the mindset everyone had a go at their very first creative writing piece 'How did this banana get so big?'. Our creative brains were flexed and there were some very imaginative suggestions; developing writing confidence now that the foundation building blocks are firmly in place will be a key feature of our learning this term. To get us started for the first two weeks our focus author will be Dr. Seuss. We watched the art hub video on how to draw The Cat in the Hat and here are the results. Why don't you try too?



ROOM 4: YEAR 2/3 MRS CAROLYNNE THOMAS ROOM 5: YEAR 2/3 MS MONIQUE WEINMAN

This term like no other will be a whirlwind of fun learning experiences for our Year 2/3s. Both classes are working together to celebrate all areas of the Curriculum. Week 1 was all things French culminating in our fabulous Bastille Day celebrations. Week 2 is Physical and Health Education week with the start of training for our Cross Country and Athletics Carnival.

Next week is HASS Week and the classes will come together for a morning of fun games and a quiz based on their learning this year. Following this will be Science Week in Term 4 with an incursion with Scitech and a follow up native plant workshop hosted by Seastariah's dad, Mark. Week 5 is Book Week so get those costumes ready and be inspired by stories based on the theme, 'Reading is my Superpower!'. Then, we will have a week celebrating all things Mathematical, all still in the planning stage but will be filled with great learning opportunities. Whew, this and so much more ahead for Term 3!







ROOM 6: YEAR 4/5 MRS SUSIE GRIGSON

During Literacy blocks this term, students will be expressing their emotions, likes and dislikes, creativity and opinions through different forms of poetry writing. In our reading sessions, students will undertake a novel study. Year 4 students will read The Butterfly Lion by Michael Morpurgo and Year 5 students will read Skellig by David Almond. Chapter reflections will be guided through three tier focus questions; literal, inferential and evaluative questions. Homophones and the correct spelling and use of these will be taught during weekly grammar sessions and reinforced through homework tasks. Our Maths activities will include calculating the area of shapes; comparing column graphs; measuring and drawing angles; finding rules in number patterns and exploring different multiplication strategies to solve a range of problems. Through our studies of Earth and Space Sciences, Year 4 students will explore how natural processes and human activity cause changes to the Earth's surface. Year 5 students will explore our solar system and identify the Earth's position in the solar system. Our focus in HASS is Geography and students will use an atlas, maps and the internet to investigate continents. The Year 4's will study the main characteristics of Africa and Europe. The Year 5's will study the characteristics of



South America and North America. During Health lessons students will look at nutritional information provided on packaging and in the media, and learn how this influences their decisions and behaviours. Students will learn to identify simple preventative measures that promote and maintain an individual's health, safety and well-being.

ROOM 7: YEAR 5/6 MR HEATH ADAMS

We are beginning our new term with three new Year 6 students. We were excited at the end of the last term that we might get one new student, but Room 7 have been bubbling at the thought of three! We extend our warm welcome to Charleston, Riieshard and Tudor, as well as their families.

This term, our focus is on the Logos, or logical thought. This will inform, at least part of the time, our learning in all of our learning areas. In English, we are learning to make clear, precise propositions that we can use to develop arguments persuasive writing. In Mathematics, we are studying how to accurately describe number patterns as an introduction to algebra and to describe geometric properties. In Science, we are focusing on physics, with the Year 6 students looking at the physics of energy and the Year 5 students looking at the physics of light. In Humanities and the Social Sciences, we are looking at the Economics of consumption as well as introducing Geography by looking at Australia and Australian's relationships with the world around us.

I hope you have all booked in your 3-Way Conference times and have returned the note informing us how your child will be getting home from school on Monday. I look forward to seeing you then.



CHAPLAINCY MATTERS

Welcome back to Term 3 NFPS Community. I am hoping everyone had a relaxing and enjoyable break. For those who I have not yet met my name is Joyce Barrett and I am your Chaplain. When Terri Emslie left during the year I was pleased to be asked to join the NFPS team. Unfortunately, I am only at NFPS for half a day on a Tuesday as I am also Chaplain at two other schools.

I am a mother of two grown up children and love my Oma (grandmother) role to my two granddaughters. To the upper primary students I introduced myself as Joyce and Mrs Barrett to the younger ones. I'm happy with either.

What work does a Chaplain do? If you don't already know, here is a short snapshot: Children can be referred to me by a parent or carer, teacher and Admin Leadership for weekly/fortnightly appointment during school time to discuss concerns they may have such as anxiety or other emotional/social issues. Many children just need



a listening ear and I like to encourage them to solve their conflicts and problems in the best way they can and so build their resilience and self-esteem and to also reinforce the school's values. Low self esteem and worries can sometimes reduce their concentration on schoolwork. One-on-one appointments are also available for teachers and parents. All conversations are private and will only be disclosed if necessary, with the permission of the person or if that person is being hurt or hurting someone.

At times I may run Social and Emotional Skills Programs. These programs may occur through various lunchtime activities. The aim of these small groups is to help students build relationships with each other and provide support and learning opportunities for children to further develop their emotional intelligence. The programs I am an accredited facilitator for are Friendship Matters (last term I ran an 8 session voluntary lunchtime Year 6 girls group), and also Seasons for Growth (loss and grief program).

If you have any concerns for your child or if you are going through various challenges please feel free to contact me (school phone, email or drop a note through the front office). I am available from 10:30am to 2:00pm every Tuesday.
