I want to thank you again for your understanding and support throughout what has been a very unusual school semester. The COVID-19 pandemic is affecting our entire community and has presented us with extraordinary challenges. I am pleased that together we have been able to ensure our student's safety and continuity of learning.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP REMINDERS

As we shared last week, we are continuing our current procedures for drop-off and pickup of children at the gates on Turton Road. This is a public intersection and we must be mindful in relation to parking and safety for everyone. It may help to ease congestion if people are able to park in the car park at the oval or on Johannah Street. We must also remember that whilst restrictions are being lifted everyone is still required to socially distance.

At the end of the school day I have reminded the students that they need to be in the care of their parents. We are concerned about the branches that are being jumped on daily, high fences that are being climbed and the potential dangers of students running across the roads. It has been lovely to see some of our families move to the oval now that the playground is open.

The Road Safety Commission recommends that children, 10 years or younger, should be supervised by adults when riding bicycles and should also wear a correct fitting helmet. It is important that all bikes are individually locked to the bike racks or fence.

PARENTS AT SCHOOL

Parents are able to come on the school site but we need to maintain the designated limits of numbers, apply hygiene practices and record where people visit should this information be required by the Department of Health. Should you need to make arrangements to speak to the class teacher or attend the Front Office, please make an appointment via email or phone.

We are pleased to let you know that tonight we will be hosting our School Board Meeting and next week, Wednesday 24th June at 6.30pm we will host a P&C meeting in Room 6. One of the strengths of our school is our community and the way in which it supports our students. We are excited to be able to meet together again. Please note the following precautions will be put in place to be COVID safe:

- ✓ We will meet in Room 6. Please use the top car park, come through the gate and use the classroom door closest to the car park.
- ✓ Everyone will be asked to follow good hygiene procedures.
- \checkmark Room 6 will be cleaned at the end of the school day and again be cleaned after the meeting.
- ✓ Desks and chairs will be set up for social distancing.
- ✓ We will be recording attendance and contact details (as normal through the minutes) for contact tracing purposes.
- ✓ Everyone is welcome to bring their own personal hot or cold drink in a flask, keeper cup etc.

For this reason, schools are not required to include A to E grades on this year's Semester 1 student reports. It also means that your child's attendance will not be reported. Teachers will be making generic comments for all learning areas describing the learning opportunities that have been provided at school and home during the semester. Each child will have a personalised general comment outlining their overall progress.

SPOTLIGHT ON OUR KINDERGARTEN STUDENTS IN ROOM 1

What an interesting start to the year we have had in Kindy. The children have begun to embrace the start of their learning journey with enthusiasm and a sense of adventure. They are settling into their daily routine and are learning to foster and build on new friendships and relationships with peers and staff. Each day brings something different.

In Literacy we are immersing ourselves in Phase One of the Letters and Sounds program. This focuses on the importance of developing good speaking and listening skills in order to support oral language development and to lay the foundations for building phonic knowledge. Our daily sessions also target developing phonological awareness, oral blending and segmenting skills. We have been exploring environmental sounds around us, instrumental sounds as well as body percussion. Activities such as listening walks, using musical instruments and singing action songs reinforce these concepts in a fun and exciting way. A favourite game is 'Teddy is lost in the jungle' where the children guide a friend to find a hidden bear using only the raising and lowering of their voice to indicate closeness to the teddy. In conjunction with Letters and Sounds the children are learning about syllables. In our morning Literacy sessions, they participate in activities that include turn-taking games, sorting and identifying syllables in words using our interactive whiteboard and physical games like leap frogging across lily pads to count parts of words.





During our Maths sessions we are learning all about recognising and correctly forming numerals in order to 10, comparing collections using the language more than, less than or the same as, and sorting, classifying and matching objects according to different attributes. Activities we use to consolidate these concepts daily include shaving cream writing, games, sensory bin hunts to find numbers using tongs before ordering them on a whiteboard as well as using tactile materials like play dough and bubble foam to show numbers in a variety of visual ways. We also reinforce our counting every day during our morning mat session by counting how many friends are present and how many are away. We use elements of maths we are learning throughout the day both inside and outside at play.

We don't get to experience the joys of specialist teachers until Pre Primary but there is no shortage of movement around the school for us as we fill our days with many wonderful activities. On our first day at Kindy we had a treasure hunt around the school following clues left behind by the Gingerbread Man. He showed us many of the exciting parts of the school we will be using throughout our learning journey, including the outdoor classroom and the Art Room. This term we have been exploring the Library and have borrowed books to take home to share with our families. We have also visited the Music Room and borrowed Mrs Branch's instruments to play making loud and soft, fast and slow sounds as well as creating many different rhythms and beats. Like the rest of the school we have been venturing down to the undercover area each Tuesday to join Miss Jenna for our Edu-Dance class. It is so much fun and there is so much to learn.



There is always so much happening in Kindy and so much to look forward to as we count our way up to 50 days of school (only 13 left to go), incursions, excursions and Semester Two. Who knows what it will bring???
