



#### **SPOTLIGHT ON LEARNING TERM 3 2021**

#### **Room 1 Kindy Mrs Miller**

Welcome back everyone. After a fun Term Two the Kindies have come back relaxed, refreshed and ready to go.

This term we are learning about 'Growth and Growing' as part of our whole school focus, 'Sustainable Produce'. It is going to be an interesting theme with lots of growing, nurturing and cooking to be done while we explore the processes associated with getting food from farm to plate. At the moment we have a market garden in our dramatic play area and are making a mural on our back wall which will continue to be a work in progress throughout the term.



This term our focus in English will be on Onset-rime and Alliteration. We will also learn how to identify and generate rhyming words. Maths is all about copying and creating simple two part



patterns, using language for measurement to describe, compare as well as order length, size, mass and height, sequencing familiar events and routines while using everyday language such as morning, afternoon and daytime also exploring duration of time like quick, slow and fast.

Working on our class mural will allow us to explore different ways of creating models and doing things as part of our Arts program, together with engaging in music making and creating simple compositions. In Science we will be focussing on the Weather.

It will be a busy term in Kindy but we are looking forward to the challenge!

#### **Room 2 Pre Primary Mrs Renay Knowles**

Term 3 is going to be another busy and fun-filled term! Room 2 came back to school with big smiles and lots to tell about their holidays. We enjoyed sharing the special items collected from our Holiday Memory Bags with all our friends. Room 2 is also looking forward to presenting the assembly to the school in Week 4 and participating in the Athletics Carnival for the first time later in the term.

We are fast approaching 100 days of school and are very excited to participate in some fun activities when we reach that milestone next week. We are continuing to develop our knowledge of letters and sounds and will continue to focus on decoding words, improving our fluency when reading and consolidating our comprehension skills. We are learning to become more independent writers and



gaining more confidence when writing recounts. In maths we have been investigating the continued patterns of shape and colour. We will also be working towards developing simple addition, ordinal numbers and matching numbers, names and quantities to 20.

In HASS we are learning about maps and will investigate the places people live in and belong to, their familiar features and why they are important to people. As part of our chemical science program we will use our five senses to investigate materials that have observable properties. This will support our whole school Semester Two theme of Sustainable Processes.

Room 2 have already made a wonderful start to the term and we are all set and ready to continue our adventure in Pre Primary.





#### Room 3 Year 1 Mrs Trisha Duffy

It was so lovely to see how excited the children were on our first day. They have settled back really well. It is going to be an action pack term with our Cross Country coming up in Week 3 and the Athletics Carnival later on in the term.

In Literacy this term we will be learning how to write different sentences, exploring narratives and continuing our Letters and Sounds phonics program.

In Science our theme is Living Things.

Our mathematical focus is on representing, comparing and ordering two digit numbers, working with equal groups (multiplication) and exploring 3D shapes and area.

In Geography our focus is on places where we will look at the natural and built features of places.

#### Room 4 Year 2 Mrs Susie Grigson

We have another busy term ahead. All the students have returned from the holidays with an enthusiasm for learning which is fantastic to be a part of. Our activities include learning and applying spelling rules in context; reading fiction and non-fiction passages and answering literal, inferential and evaluative questions to demonstrate understanding. We are also learning to use appropriate vocabulary and grammar for different writing genres; writing reports to inform, letters and posters to persuade and creatively to entertain our readers. Through integrated curriculum activities we will explore the semester theme of *Sustainable Produce*. During Biological Science activities students will explore how living things grow, change and have offspring similar to themselves, discovering different characteristics of life stages.





During Technology lessons, we will explore patterns that exist within data and create and follow a sequence of steps for a specific outcome. In History we will investigate the impact of changing technology on people's lives (e.g. at home, work, travel, communication) and how technology of the past differs from today. Health lessons will introduce students to what it means 'to grow, be healthy and active'. Maths lessons include using addition and subtraction strategies to solve maths problems involving two-digit numbers presented in different ways; working with duration of time and calculating five minute intervals; measuring, comparing and solving problems involving capacity and centimetres; skip counting by 2s and 5s and working with multiplication.

#### Room 5 Year 3/4 Miss Monique Weinman

Room 5 is diving into a brand new integrated learning project, the Olympics and Paralympics. Our learning focus will be Reading, Writing, Geography, History and Maths. We have started our learning journey by reflecting and researching the Ancient Olympic games and how they began. We have worked collaboratively to answer some of the students' questions about how the Olympics started.

Next, we will discover where the Olympics are being held in 2021 (Tokyo, Japan) and the impacts of the postponement for not only the athletes but tourists, the economy and the environment. The Olympic Opening Ceremony begins at 7pm on Friday 23rd July. Room 5 students will be researching the countries that are participating in this year's Olympics and Paralympics and build their understanding of the country they choose. They will work towards building a country fact file and keep a medal tally. We will be finding out more information on worldwide olympians and paralympians. Students will be working on their research skills with online searches and non-fiction books to create information reports.

This integrated project will also look at how different countries and cultures create different cuisines. We will be writing out recipes to try that represent some of the countries we are researching. Later on in the term we will have a go at cooking them, and having a feast to celebrate.

#### Room 6 Year 4/5 Mrs Carolynne Thomas

I absolutely love Term 3; it is all about hitting the ground running. We as a class have established our learning styles and expectations. It is time now to put these learning, into practise and consolidate our skills.

Our Curriculum is brimming with activities with the light shining on Book Week to enhance literacy skills and maths will be business as usual with the added benefit of a whole-school incursion from World of Maths. Science Week focuses on our school theme Sustainable Food Journey and then up to the stars in the night sky with a school visit from Scitech. Health is all about Friendly Schools and a special St John Ambulance First Aid workshop.

Our class assembly will be held in Week 8; a special surprise to come. Physical Education is a highlight this term with the school and inter-school Cross Country and school Athletics Carnival being a focus. Add in the school Spelling Bee, Father's Day and Term 3 is looking to be our biggest and brightest term yet.

#### Room 7 Year 5/6 Mr Heath Adams

I'm really excited to be back in Room 7 after my short period up in the Administration role last semester. Term 3 is always a big term, with little interruptions and a lot of opportunity to complete a lot of curriculum. But we also have some big events we are involved in like Cross Country, Athletics Carnivals and the Magpie Cafe.

This term, in English, we are learning about logical syllogisms. Students have been analysing statements to work out which are simple matters of opinion, and which can be verified and proven to be true. They are then learning some classical proofs to derive logical conclusions and how to use these to present a case in a formal debate. We will also be returning to study narrative and the structures used in different genres of story.





In Mathematics, we are focusing a lot more on common fractions as well as Geometry this term. Students will continue to receive homework sheets each week, although students have also been planning their own study routine, engaging with other study resources instead such as the videos or the investigations tasks that I have placed on *Connect*.

Our Science focus will be Physics. The Year 5s are beginning the term with a focus on light energy, while the Year 6s look at energy in general. This will include electrical energy, and I have been asking students to collect information about electrical devices in their home

as well as reflecting on household energy usage and how we might make changes to live more sustainably.

In Technologies, we are studying engineering principles and investigating materials to complete a range of constructions tasks in order to develop our production process skills. In Health, we will be looking at Sun Smart, dental and dietary health, including where to seek accurate information.



In HASS, we turn our attention to Geography, Economics and Business. The students will be participating in a game I have designed called "Diplomacy" in which they play the roles of



Australian diplomats working in another country for the Department of Foreign Affairs. The Year 5s have been posted to countries in North and South America and the Year 6s have been posted to countries in Asia. The students work through cards, describing the kinds of issues countries have to work through with each other, completing tasks to learn about their country and rolling dice to collect points for a reward system within the game. I've been getting very excited

developing it and I'm really pleased with how they've been engaging so far. The tasks that they work in can form part of their home study routine if you have one established in your household.

Last, but not least, we welcome Moira Cullen from Notre Dame university to our class as she completes her final teaching practicum. She has given me the following statement to include: "Hello, my name is Miss Cullen and I will be joining Room 7 and Mr Adams for all of Term 3. I am very excited to meet you all and share my passion for teaching! I am in the final year of my Bachelor of Primary Education at Notre Dame University, and I am specialising in Theatre Arts. I believe that all students deserve the chance to succeed and aim to foster a positive classroom climate. I look forward to meeting you all in Term 3!"
