We have welcomed our two new students this term and welcomed back another who left Room 7 earlier in the year. After camp, the students have settled back into our usual routines. A lot of the camp activities were focused on team building and creative thinking. I have decided that we will be continuing some of these activities as part of our Health curriculum over the next few weeks, hopefully helping our new students to connect with the class and foster positive relationships in general.

Another few things I'd direct parents to are:

Fire Truck Visit at NFPS

We had an incursion from Fremantle Fire Station. The firefighters brought their fire truck and our Year 3 students spent time learning about the day in the life of a fire fighter, home fire safety and even had a go blasting the fire hose. This incursion went through a few key learning points.

- 1 metre from the heater (all objects including toys, clothes and people) need to be one metre away from the heater at all times to avoid fire danger. We will be using this rule with our classroom heater too.

- Have a fire evacuation plan for each house you live at. (A template was sent home today and we talked about how to create a fire safe evacuation plan - if you could create one and run through the evacuation drill that will put students' minds at ease).

 Charge devices on solid non flammable surfaces and store them away from beds and bedding at night. (Students are encouraged to give devices
 ipads, switches and phones - to parents for safe storage and charging overnight.)

- Check power outlets for safe electrical use. Unplug and turn off electrical appliances when not in use.

- Identifying safe fires and unsafe fires (stove tops and contained heater fires can be safe if used with adult guidance).

This was a very informative and valuable learning experience for our class. We also practised the fire drill for school today. Sometimes conversations about emergencies can be unsettling for students - please be aware numerous questions about "what if..." came up and some related to their own homes - it would be wonderful if you could talk through these scenarios to answer questions I couldn't.
